Each month this section of the newsletter will be used to give kudos to one of our awesome staff members.





Need a diffuser?

What exactly is a **diffuser**? They are words that, as a Teacher or Paraprofessional, you can say to redirect a student's behavior towards the direction of success in the classroom.

This is so boring!!



Oh, this certainly is boring John. In fact, one day you might need this and you won't find it boring. I remember when I was your age, it was 1989.....



Well Mr. Stein, you just fell into the students' diffuser of not wanting to participate in your classroom expectations.

The "I'm bored" diffuser!

Tips:

- Keep it short and direct!
 - "Nevertheless..." Keep going with your teaching.
 - "I understand..." and continue with the lesson.

This short, direct statement, allows the student to know you heard them, but you continue with the lesson.

Don't engage in a long, drawn out conversation.
